## From Bishop Yoos about Hurricane Harvey Support

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

I know that you have been deeply moved by the images and stories of rescue and neighbors helping neighbors in the wake of Hurricane Harvey. It was only two years ago that we experienced devastating flood waters in the midlands when between 24-30 inches of rainfall came down. By comparison, there are places in Houston and the Gulf Coast that have already received over 50 inches of rainfall.

Please keep the families and individuals in your prayers of those who have lost their homes and those who are now living in shelters. At the same time, pray for the Texas

National Guard, the local authorities, and all the volunteers that are still rescuing people from flooded neighborhoods.

There is one more thing you and I can do to make a difference. The ELCA's Lutheran Disaster Response has a long history of faithfully responding to disasters and staying involved through every phase of response, recovery and rebuilding. Cindy and I just sent a check in this morning marked for Hurricane Harvey. There is a link in this enews that will give you the information you need to make a difference.
